

WHAT SHOULD YOU KNOW ABOUT LEGALIZED RECREATIONAL MARIJUANA?

The Union County Drug Free Coalition is on a mission to empower youth and adults to lead healthy substance-free lives. Eight years of data from states that have legalized recreational marijuana have shown increases in youth use, drugged driving, industrial accidents, hiring shortages, marijuana addiction, and criminal activity.

Please consider the following:

- Youth who use marijuana before age 18 are 4 to 7 times more likely than adults to develop a marijuana use disorder. Legalizing sends the message to our youth that marijuana is not harmful, which has the potential to increase youth use.^{1,2}
- **Employees** who tested positive for marijuana had 55% more industrial accidents, 85% more injuries, and 75% greater absenteeism compared to those who tested negative³.
- **Economic impact** from marijuana sales does not match the costs. In Colorado, for every \$1 of tax revenue, the state spends \$4.50 counteracting legalization's effects.⁴
- **Criminal activities**, such as illicit markets, have thrived in every "legal" state, such as Oregon, where illegal marijuana makes up more than 70% of the market⁵.
- Increases in addiction and other mental health disorders are associated with high potency THC products.⁶
